



Dinosaurs — Amazing Giants of Long Ago

Dinosaurs were **giant** animals that lived on **earth** millions of years ago. They were not alive when your grandparents were young. Some were as big as a school bus! Others were smaller than a cat. They are some of the most amazing animals that ever walked the land.

Some dinosaurs loved to **eat** green **plants** and leaves. They had very **long** necks to reach the tops of tall trees. Other dinosaurs were meat-eaters. They had big, **sharp** teeth and strong legs. These fast hunters could chase and catch other animals very quickly.

All dinosaurs had a **tail** at the back of their body. Some used their tails to help them balance when they walked. Others used their tails to hit enemies and stay safe. Their skin could be green, gray, or brown — just like a big lizard today.

How do we know about dinosaurs? We find their bones inside **rock** and **earth**. These old bones are called fossils. Scientists dig them up carefully. From just one **tooth** or bone, a scientist can learn so much about how a dinosaur looked and lived.

About 66 million years ago, all the dinosaurs **died**. A huge rock fell from space and crashed into the earth. The sky turned dark and cold — too cold for these **giant** animals to live. Today, we still find their bones and learn their amazing stories.
