A wolf is a **big animal** that lives in the wild. It looks like a large dog, but it is not a pet. Wolves have thick gray or brown fur, long legs, and sharp teeth. They live in cold forests and snowy mountains all around the world.

Wolves live in a group called a **pack**. A pack is like a wolf family. Every pack has a **leader** who helps keep the group safe. The wolves work together to find **food** and take care of their young pups. No wolf lives alone — the pack always stays together.

Wolves eat meat. They hunt big animals like deer and moose. Wolves can **run** very **fast** — up to 60 kilometers per hour! A pack works as a team to catch food. Each wolf has a job. Together, they are very strong and very smart hunters.

A wolf has a great **nose**. It can smell other animals from far away. Wolves can also **hear** very small sounds with their big ears. At **night**, they howl at the moon. The howl is loud and long. Wolves howl to talk to each other and find their friends.

Long ago, people hunted many wolves, and there were very few left. Today, people in many countries protect them. Wolves are important for nature. They help forests stay healthy and balanced. If you ever hear a howl in the forest at night — that is a wolf saying hello!
